Loss and hope

Dear All

This time of year seems to be all about remembering. Sunday 1^{st} November is All Saints day where we remember those who have been champions of our faith. Monday 1^{st} is All Souls day where we remember those loved ones who are no longer with us. On November the 8^{th} we mark remembrance Sunday, thinking of all those whose lives have been lost and changed because of war. Just two weeks ago we held the wave of light service where we remembered and stood alongside all those who have lost babies during pregnancy or in early infancy. As I led that service, I had no idea that just two weeks later I would find myself sharing in that grief in a very real and raw way.

These last few days I have been a bit of a mess if I'm honest, very sadly on Sunday we experienced a miscarriage at 3 months pregnant. I say experienced but the truth is that my body is still going through it and it has felt traumatic both physically and emotionally. Each hour this week has seen my emotions fluctuating from a deep sense of grief, to hope, to hopelessness, to being very matter of fact and wanting to forget this has happened, to guilt that perhaps I did something that made it happen and couldn't protect the little one I was so excited to be carrying.

Loss and grief are horrendous things and not something we find easy to talk about. We often don't know what to say or do for people experiencing grief. I am also aware that I am not alone this week in knowing grief. Many of us have our own experience of loss - it is a lived experience for many of us on a daily basis - no matter how long ago your loss may have been. I want to encourage you with a line from the eucharistic prayer that has stuck with me this week which says this 'how wonderful the work of your hands O Lord, as a mother tenderly embraces her children....God embraces us'. God understands the heart of a mother and a father, God feels our pain, knows are grief, embraces us even, and especially, in the dark times.

I have not really had the words to be able to pray words for myself this week but, I know that God has been present with every single tear that I have shed in every moment of pain that I feel and will face many times over the next few days and weeks. I have however been able to pray for others that I know are expe-
