**Palm Sunday**

Dear All,

Hope you are all doing well - I sure many of us can't quite believe that it's been a year now since the start of the pandemic. This last week we have reflected on the many lives that have been lost over the last year but, also the hope we have for the future. Hope is something that we discover in the joy of the

Easter message however, before we get to the Easter celebration we first journey through **Holy week** starting on Palm Sunday. Holy week is a significant time that invites us to enter into Jesus' passion by 'handing ourselves over' to the events of this week...Mary's costly act of preparation for Jesus' burial, Jesus' final teaching regarding the cost of discipleship, the tenderness of the Last Supper, the pain of betrayal, Jesus handing himself over to his enemies in the garden of Gethsemane, the arduous journey to the cross, the despair of Holy Saturday and the joy of resurrection Sunday.

For some of us, we might like to take a few moments each day for personal contemplation or join with others throughout the week.

**Each day at 7.30pm (Monday - Thursday)** we have an opportunity to join, via zoom, with St Mary Magdalene, Taunton as Bishop Brian Castle leads us in a short reflection. There are also going to be daily reflections available on the Bath and Wells website which you might find helpful.

On **Maundy Thursday** the church will be open for individual prayer in the morning and again for private reflection during the an hour 'at the Cross' from **2-3pm on Good Friday** or, the option to join again with St Mary Magdalene for Brian Castle's final reflection at 2.30pm.

At **9.30am on Easter day**, I'm really excited that we have the opportunity to receive communion together back in the church building. Whilst we are still not allowed to sing it will be wonderful to celebrate together the joy of Easter! We realise that some of you may not be able to make it to the building and so we hope to still put something online so that everyone can be included - zoom coffee will also remain for a while yet!

Easter brings with it a sense of hope for us all. As a PCC we have been thinking and praying about our vision as we continue to journey through vacancy. The hope we have as we move forward is that we might 'love, serve and welcome all, as a nourishing community, passionate and energised by our faith.' This is really exciting place for us to be in so, let's be expectant, as we listen and follow in the footsteps of Christ, in all that lies ahead.

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" just say this, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately."' They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,  
'Hosanna!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!  
Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David!  
Hosanna in the highest heaven!

Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
